Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 10<sup>th</sup> 2015, Joan Marsh and I of AT&T Services, Inc. met with Matthew Berry, Chief of Staff for Commissioner Ajit Pai.

We discussed the different technical approaches available to corrections officials to address the problems of contraband wireless devices including detection systems and managed access. In particular, we noted that AT&T has worked extensively with the various providers to provide access to AT&T spectrum and to assist in the deployment of systems across the country. Among other things, AT&T has developed a unified approach for vendors to use to gain access to AT&T spectrum and simplified its leasing process to facilitate such access. We further explained that a step the Commission could take that would facilitate the deployment of these services is to clarify the obligations of the managed access vendors under the CPNI and other privacy rules.
