The principles of user choice and control are vitally important for a vibrant wireless ecosystem. But as written, the NPRM threatens to undermine these ideals by limiting what users can do with their devices. That's a concern, because I want to be able to update my own wireless software?not rely on slow manufacturers shipping updates.

The draft rules could enable device manufacturers to forbid third-party software, which would make me feel less safe about the wireless networks I use and operate.

I have found the third party software gives me more security and versatility with my router. I can fine tune it so I can receive a higher quality connection all through the house. I can create a more direct connection with my devices and the difference is incredible. I can use one router for my whole house versus two or three. The manufacturer's software is so basic that it actually disables your internet connection experience. As a hobbyist, I also enjoy the ability of tinkering and fine tuning my equipment. This would also stifle any advancement in software development. Please reconsider your limiting of router software. Thank You
