The principles of user choice and control are vitally important for a vibrant wireless ecosystem. But as written, the NPRM threatens to undermine these ideals by limiting what users can do with their devices. That's a concern, because I want to be able to update my own wireless software?not rely on slow manufacturers shipping updates.

The draft rules could enable device manufacturers to forbid third-party software, which would make me feel less safe about the wireless networks I use and operate.

Time and time again, OEMs have been shown to have vulnerable systems and when they do have a fix it is often very delayed. The open source community stays aware of these issues (often discovers these issues) and responds much quicker.

If you want to do something useful, why don't you start blocking all the malicious hacking coming into our systems so we don't have to depend so heavily on the open source community for safety
