Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 19, 2015, National Hispanic Media Coalition (NHMC) President & CEO Alex Nogales, Vice President of Policy Michael Scurato, and Policy Associate Andy Lomeli met in person with Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel and Special Advisor & Confidential Assistant Jennifer Thompson.

NHMC discussed the importance of the Lifeline program in the Latino community and the importance of modernizing the program to include broadband. Specifically, the Latino community suffers disproportionately from the phenomenon Commissioner Rosenworcel has coined the “homework gap”—describing the difficulties students face in completing homework assignments because of a lack of access of broadband Internet. NHMC noted that many Latino students stand to benefit from increased educational and economic opportunities through program modernization.
