ORDER

Under consideration are matters reported in Joint Status Report and Motion to Stay filed by the Enforcement Bureau on November 18, 2015, on behalf of Maritime, Choctaw and the Enforcement Bureau.

It is represented that the Bankruptcy Court that is adjudicating the bankruptcy of Maritime and its principal Donald DePriest has discharged Mr. DePriest's debts, including certain guarantees of Maritimes' creditors that were the basis for the Commission rejecting Maritime's earlier application for Second Thursday relief.¹ *See Maritime Communications, Memorandum Opinion and Order*, FCC 14M-133, released September 11, 2014.

In view of Mr. DePriest's debts being discharged thereby removing a significant impediment to the Commission granting Second Thursday relief, Maritime and Choctaw have requested reconsideration of the Commission's denial order. The Bureau has made no objection to the Petition for Reconsideration that is now before the Commission for decision.

Ruling

For cause shown, **IT IS ORDERED** that the Motion for Stay **IS GRANTED** until a date on which the commission issues a final order approving or denying Maritime's and Choctaw's request for reconsideration of granting Second Thursday relief in this case.
