Dear Mr. Wheeler,

I am writing in support of the proposed merger between Time Warner Cable (TWC), Bright House Networks (BNH), and Charter Communications. The partnership would be beneficial to the 17th Legislative District which I serve as State Representative and Clark County in general as Charter Communications is located in my district and employees many folks here in Clark County. This merger would have a positive impact on our economic growth.

I also believe that this merger would improve telecommunication performance and provide better service for their customers. Charter offers a minimum broadband speed of 60 Mbps for less money than TWC or BHN with clear, uniform pricing across its service area. This broadband speed is available without any data-caps, usage based pricing, modem or early termination fees. The newly merged corporation, New Charter, will offer this extremely fast broadband service to TWC and BNH customers regardless of location.

New Charter will provide jobs and improved service to my area and constituents. They will also remain committed to net neutrality and will not block or slow down Internet traffic, engage in paid prioritization, and will not impose data caps or usage-based billing. We commend Charter's commitment to bring back jobs from overseas call centers and to improve customer service.

I would recommend supporting this proposed merger.
