Dear Mr. May:

Pursuant to section 20.18(q)(10) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 20.18(q)(10), Verizon has agreed to an alternate timeframe to begin delivering 9-1-1 text messages to the following Public Safety Answering Points ("PSAPs"):

1886	Hawaii County, HI
1887	Honolulu, HI

1889	Maui County, HI

The Commission's registry has designated these PSAPs as ready for text-to-911 service as of May 27, 2015.¹ Verizon has successfully tested 911 text message delivery and is prepared to begin delivering 911 text messages to these PSAPs immediately, but effective November 23, 2015, at the request of the PSAPs' governing authority (the Hawaii E-911 Board) Verizon will begin delivering 911 text messages to those PSAPs on a phased-in basis beginning in December 2015.
