Our region is home to a majority Hispanic population, and we want our exhibits to reflect and engage the diversity of our community. Many of our residents are also economically disadvantaged and lack the access to technology resources that are so valued in our schools, workforce and personal lives.

We are pleased to support the merger of Charter Communications, Time Warner Cable and Bright House Networks into New Charter. The companies' proposal outlines clearly how it would invest in community development and seize opportunities to make a positive impact.
