**ERRATUM TO COMMENTS OF XO COMMUNICATIONS, LLC IN SUPPORT OF
U.S. TELEPACIFIC CORP. PETITION FOR CLARIFICATION**

On December 28, 2015, XO Communications, LLC (“XO”) filed comments in support of the U.S. TelePacific Corp. (“U.S. TelePacific”) petition in the above captioned matter to “clarify that where the loss of access to retired copper leads to a discontinuance of retail service, the two processes must be harmonized.”¹ In its comments, XO advocated for a clarification that a Section 214 discontinuance application by a competitive provider should be subject to an automatic grant when predicated on a copper retirement noticed by an incumbent local exchange carrier (“ILEC”) if the competitive provider’s application is filed at least forty days prior to the retirement.² XO hereby submits this erratum to clarify that XO used the term “filed” in its

comments to refer to the *submission* of the Section 214 discontinuance petition with the Commission, not the date of its public notice as defined in Section 63.71 of the Commission's rules.³ While XO believes this intention was clear in its comments, it submits this erratum out of an abundance of caution in order to avoid any confusion as to the meaning of the term "filed" in the foregoing context.
