MUST-CARRY COMPLAINT

PMCM TV, LLC (“PMCM”), pursuant to Section 614 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (47 U.S.C. Section 534), and Sections 76.7 and 76.61 of the Commission’s Rules, hereby files this Complaint requesting that the Commission order Service Electric Cable TV of New Jersey Inc., d/b/a Service Electric Broadband Cable, including any subsidiaries or affiliates (“SECTV-NJ”) to carry local commercial television station WJLP(DT), licensed to serve Middletown Township, New Jersey (the “Station”) on its over-the-air channel number 3 in accordance with the Commission’s must carry rules and policies on all cable television systems owned and operated by SECTV-NJ throughout the New York, New York designated market area (the “DMA”) for the remaining duration of the current must carry election cycle, expiring December 31, 2017.

I. ACTION BY THE FULL COMMISSION IS CALLED FOR

The right of Station WJLP(DT) to be carried on cable channel 3 and/ or be assigned major PSIP channel 3 has been before the Commission four or five times over the last year and a half. The full Commission has not acted on any of the various applications for review which have been presented to it. Without guidance from the Commission, the Bureau has had to deal with novel

issues of PSIP assignment which have resulted not only in a bizarre result here (e.g., finding that WJLP(DT)'s channel is allotted to both the Hartford-New Haven DMA *and* the Philadelphia DMA but not to the New York DMA where the station is actually firmly placed by the Table of Allotments). The Bureau has also followed a policy, as noted above, of deeming a station's "over-the-air" broadcast channel to be its PSIP channel rather than the channel on whose frequency it radiates a broadcast signal. This policy, which appears to fly directly in the face of the statutory mandate, has never been reviewed by the full Commission.

These circumstances have left all of the parties in a state of limbo since the full Commission has not definitively affirmed WJLP(DT)'s statutory right to be carried on its over the air channel. Everyone has had to tread water awaiting a clear declaration from the Commission, leaving many of the 22 million hapless consumers in the New York DMA unable to view WJLP(DT)'s programming at all (because their cable system is not carrying it or because half the TV sets in the United States do not properly translate PSIP channels into viewing channels in the circumstances presented here). Where WJLP(DT)'s channel is available, it pops up on different channels on different cable systems, making it difficult for consumers in different parts of the market to locate the cable channel on which it can be found. The unanticipated problem with PSIP reception also restricts the ability of the Commission to repack channels in the aftermath of the Incentive Auction and will require a major public education effort on a par with the DTV transition program to alert viewers that they will have to take unusual steps to watch the channels they want to watch.

There is therefore an urgent need for the Commission to untangle this situation quickly since the current situation seems to be spawning an ever-widening circle of unanticipated consequences that could radically upset the way TV stations are received and identified in this country.

II. SECTV-NJ HAS DENIED WJLP(DT) ITS FULL CARRIAGE AND CHANNEL PLACEMENT RIGHTS

In a letter dated October 22, 2015 (the “Carriage Request”), PMCM notified SECTV-NJ that its failure to carry the Station throughout the DMA on its over-the-air Channel 3 constituted a failure by SECTV-NJ to comply with the Communications Act and the Commission’s must-carry rules. A copy of the Carriage Request is attached to this Petition at its Exhibit 1. The Carriage Request demanded that SECTV-NJ commence carriage of the Station on channel 3 on all of SECTV-NJ’s cable systems serving the DMA. SECTV-NJ responded by letter dated November 18, 2015 denying PMCM’s request for carriage on Channel 3 (the “Carriage Denial”). A copy of the Carriage Denial is attached to this Petition at its Exhibit 2. As of the date of this complaint, SECTV-NJ, to the best of PMCM’s knowledge, does not carry WJLP(DT) on any channel on any of its Systems in the New York DMA.

Section 76.61(a)(5) provides that any must-carry complaint must be filed within 60 days of either a cable operator’s denial of a carriage request or the expiration of the 30-day response period set forth in Section 76.61(a)(2). SECTV-NJ’s Carriage Denial was dated November 18, 2015, and this Complaint is therefore timely filed under Section 76.61(a)(5).

III. WJLP IS ENTITLED TO MANDATORY CARRIAGE ON CHANNEL 3 ON ALL OF SECTV-NJ’S CABLE SYSTEMS IN THE NEW YORK, NEW YORK DMA

Under the Communications Act and the Commission’s Rules, a station is entitled to mandatory carriage on cable systems if it is a “local commercial television station,” as defined in Section 614(h)(1) of the Communications Act and Section 76.55(c) of the Commission’s Rules. Sections 614(h)(1) and 76.55(c) define a “local commercial television station” as any full power television broadcast station that is 1) licensed to a community within the same television market as the cable system, 2) not considered a distant signal pursuant to the cable compulsory copyright license, and 3) capable of delivering a good quality over-the-air signal to the system’s principal

headend or willing to agree to be responsible for the costs of delivering such a signal through alternative means. WJLP(DT) qualifies as a local commercial television station on the New York DMA Systems operated by SECTV-NJ and therefore is entitled to mandatory carriage. While SECTV-NJ in the Carriage Denial raised questions about the wording of PMCM's Carriage Demand, it did not claim that WJLP(DT) in fact failed to meet any of the requirements for carriage as a local commercial television station.

Pursuant to Section 614(b)(6) of the Communications Act and Section 76.57 of the Commission's Rules, a station is entitled to carriage on (i) the channel number on which the station is "broadcast over the air," (ii) the channel number on which the station was carried on July 19, 1985 or January 1, 1992, or (iii) a channel mutually agreed to by the station and cable television system operator. WJLP(DT) broadcasts on over the air RF channel 3, and was not carried on SECTV-NJ's systems in 1985 or 1992. Pursuant to Section 76.57(e) a station is to notify the cable system of its channel election at the same time as it elects must-carry status. By letter dated September 18, 2014, a copy of which is attached to this Petition as Exhibit 3, PMCM elected mandatory carriage on Channel 3 on all systems operated by SECTV-NJ in the DMA.

As the Commission is well aware, a dispute arose regarding the "virtual" PSIP channel to be used by WJLP(DT). As a result of that dispute a number of MVPDs (although not SECTV-NJ), requested that the Commission allow those MVPDs to defer implementing WJLP(DT)'s carriage and channel positioning election. The Media Bureau granted that deferral by letter dated July 25, 2014.¹ In June 2015, in two separate letter decisions, the Bureau (i) determined that WJLP(DT) would be assigned PSIP channel 33,² and (ii) lifted its deferral of WJLP(DT)'s carriage rights.³ In

the Carriage Letter Decision, the Bureau gave PMCM the option of accepting carriage on Channel 33, or invoking the Commission's complaint procedures to enforce its previous election for carriage on Channel 3.

In its Carriage Denial, SECTV-NJ states that it "remains unclear" what channel position WJLP(DT) is entitled to. As PMCM has explained in detail in its previous filings with the Commission both Section 614(b)(6) of the Communications Act and Section 76.57 of the FCC's rules require a cable operator to carry a local broadcast station electing "must-carry" status on the channel on which the station is broadcast "over the air." Channel 3 is the channel designated by the FCC Table of Allotments for WJLP(DT) to broadcast over the air, and that is in fact that channel on which the station broadcasts.

We note in this regard that the Media Bureau has in some cases taken the position that a must-carry station's cable carriage position is determined by its major PSIP number rather than the channel associated with the frequency on which it broadcasts over the air. PMCM respectfully suggests that that position is directly at odds with Section 614(b)(6) of the Act, which requires carriage "on the cable system channel number on which the local commercial television station is broadcast over the air." The FCC's Post- DTV Transition Table of Allotments specifies that the "channel" allotted to Middletown Township is channel "3" and the frequency on which channel 3 must broadcast over the air is 60-66 Mhz. 47 C.F.R Section 73.603(a). Indeed, Part 73 repeatedly and universally identifies a station's "channel" with the channel allotted to it in the Table of Allotments and the frequency on which it radiates its signal. To define a station's channel in any other way (such as by its PSIP major channel number which may be arbitrarily assigned by the Commission) would subvert the entire channel-based regulatory scheme of Part 73 of the rules.

This is especially true for two reasons. First, Section 614(h)(1)(A) of the Act defines a local commercial television station to be a station “licensed and operating on a channel regularly assigned to its community by the Commission that, with respect to a particular cable system, is within the same cable television market as the cable system.” PSIPs are not the channel of which stations are “licensed,” nor are PSIPs “assigned to communities.” For cable carriage purposes, therefore, a station whose “channel” is defined by a PSIP channel different from the channel allotted to it in the Table of Allotments would not be entitled to cable carriage at all since it would not meet the statutory definition of a local commercial television station. Yet Congress plainly and expressly intended all of the cable carriage rights set forth in Section 614 to attach to stations operating over the channels which are found in the Table of Allotments where channels *are* assigned to local communities. To now suddenly tie cable carriage rights exclusively to PSIPs rather than allotted channels would in one stroke upset the cable carriage rights of possibly hundreds of stations across the country. This cannot be what Congress intended, and implementation of this interpretation would again wreak chaos in the broadcast marketplace. Indeed, if PSIPs were to exclusively govern carriage rights, Congress would certainly have written that requirement into the statute.

Second, as PMCM has pointed out elsewhere, the Spectrum Act⁴ bars the Commission from involuntarily changing WJLP’s channel until the Incentive Auction is over. WJLP operated on channel 3 with PSIP 3 for almost five years. If its “channel” were deemed to be defined by its PSIP, a compelled change from channel 3 to channel 33 would plainly constitute a change in its channel in direct violation of the Spectrum Act.

In its June 5 Carriage Letter Decision, the Media Bureau explicitly provided that, in the event cable systems refused to carry WJLP(DT) on its requested Channel 3, that “PMCM may choose to invoke the cable carriage enforcement procedures” set forth in the Communications Act and the Commission’s Rules. In its Carriage Denial, SECTV-NJ notes that it “may have to seek an order from the FCC clarifying [WJLP(DT)]’s channel positioning rights.” PMCM, by initiating this complaint procedure, seeks just such an order.

CONCLUSION

PMCM is entitled to mandatory carriage of the signal of WJLP(DT) on its over-the-air Channel 3 on all cable systems operated by SECTV-NJ in the New York DMA. WJLP(DT) has properly elected mandatory carriage, has notified SECTV-NJ of its choice to be carried on its over-the-air Channel 3, has notified SECTV-NJ of its failure to comply with the Commission’s mandatory carriage rules with respect to WJLP(DT), and has requested that SECTV-NJ commence carriage of the Station on Channel 3. SECTV-NJ has denied PMCM’s request, forcing PMCM to file this Complaint. For the reasons set forth herein, PMCM hereby respectfully requests that the Commission order SECTV-NJ to carry WJLP(DT) on Channel 3 throughout the New York, New York DMA in accordance with the Communications Act and the Commission’s must carry rules and policies adopted to implement the Act. Given the lengthy time – more than a year and a half – during which WJLP(DT) has been denied carriage on its rightful channel, expedited action by the Commission would be appropriate.

DECLARATION OF ROBERT MC ALLAN

1. My name is Robert Mc Allan. I am Managing Member of PMCM TV, LLC, licensee of WJLP(DT).
2. I have reviewed the foregoing Must-Carry Complaint and all factual matters set forth therein are true to the best of my knowledge and belief. To the best of my knowledge, information, and belief formed after reasonable inquiry, the foregoing Must-Carry Complaint is well grounded in fact; warranted by existing law or a good faith argument for the extension, modification or reversal of existing law; and is not interposed for any improper purpose.
3. On September 18, 2014, WJLP(DT) (then operating under call sign KVVV(DT)) sent a letter to Service Electric Cable TV of New Jersey Inc., d/b/a Service Electric Broadband Cable ("SECTV-NJ") electing mandatory carriage of the station's signal on Channel 3 all cable systems operated by SECTV-NJ in the New York, New York DMA during the election cycle expiring December 31, 2017.
4. On October 22, 2015, I mailed a letter to SECTV-NJ notifying SECTV-NJ of its failure to retransmit the signal of WJLP(DT) on Channel 3 on all of its cable systems in the New York DMA and requesting that SECTV-NJ commence such carriage. Postal records show that letter was received by SECTV-NJ on October 26, 2015.
5. SECTV-NJ responded by letter dated November 18, 2015 denying WJLP(DT)'s request for carriage on Channel 3.

Dear Mr. Williams:

PMCM TV, LLC ("PMCM") is the licensee of television station WJLP(DT). WJLP(DT) is licensed to Middletown Township, New Jersey, which is located within the New York, New York Designated Market Area (the "DMA"). Service Electric Cable TV of New Jersey Inc., d/b/a Service Electric Broadband Cable and/or its subsidiaries and affiliates ("Service Electric") operates one or more cable television systems serving communities located within the New York DMA, including without limitation systems serving the New Jersey counties of Sussex, Warren, and Morris (the "Systems"). As more fully described herein, PMCM hereby puts you on notice in accordance with Section 76.61 of the rules of the Federal Communications Commission (the "FCC") that Service Electric's carriage of WJLP(DT) on the Systems is not compliant with our must-carry election or the Commission's rules.

By letter dated October 22, 2015 and pursuant to Section 76.64(f) of the FCC's rules, PMCM elected mandatory carriage on the Systems for the election cycle beginning on January 1, 2015 and ending December 31, 2017.¹ Because WJLP(DT)² elected must-carry status on the Systems and because WJLP(DT) is a local commercial broadcast television station with respect to the Systems, WJLP(DT) is entitled to mandatory carriage on the Systems. Pursuant to Section 76.57 of the FCC's rules, WJLP(DT) elected to be carried on Channel 3, the station's over-the-air channel number.

Carriage of WJLP(DT) will not cause the Systems to exceed the maximum number of signals a cable system is required to carry under the FCC's must carry rules. WJLP(DT) does not and will not share a broadcast network affiliation with, or substantially duplicate the

signal from WJLP(DT), PMCM agrees, at its own cost, to ensure deliver of a good quality signal of WJLP(DT) through alternative means.

Both Section 614(b)(6) of the Communications Act and Section 76.57 of the FCC's rules require a cable operator to carry a local commercial broadcast station electing "must-carry" status on the channel on which the station is broadcast "over the air." Channel 3 is the channel designated by the FCC Table of Allotments for WJLP to broadcast over the air, and that is in fact that channel we broadcast on. Therefore, there is no lawful reason for Service Electric to refuse to carry WJLP (DT) on Channel 3 on any part of the Systems.

We understand that Service Electric currently fails to carry the signal of WJLP(DT) on Channel 3 in at least some of the communities served by the Systems. PMCM is therefore notifying you pursuant to Section 76.61(a)(1) of the FCC's rules that Service Electric has failed to meet its statutory and regulatory carriage obligations.

Although this notice is necessary to preserve PMCM's rights under the FCC's rules, we continue to hope that Service Electric carriage of WJLP(DT) on the proper channel will commence without resort to the FCC's complaint procedures.

Thank you for your attention to this matter.



Dear Mr. McAllan:

This firm represents Service Electric Cable TV of New Jersey, Inc., (“SECTV-NJ”). We are in receipt of your letter of October 22, 2015, concerning carriage of WJLP(DT), licensed to Middletown Township, New Jersey on the SECTV-NJ system serving Sussex County, New Jersey. For the reasons specified below, SECTV-NJ rejects your must-carry demand.

First, your letter contains no address information for response. We are therefore sending this to the address contained in the FCC database for WJLP(DT), with a copy to the addresses provided in prior correspondence from the station.

Second, your letter references an election letter “dated October 22, 2015.” My client is not in receipt of an election letter of that date. Please provide a copy of the October 22, 2015 election letter.

Third, there appears to have been an error in the final production of your letter, as the carryover sentence from page 1 to 2 states as follows:

“WJLP(DT) does not and will not share a broadcast network affiliation with, or substantially duplicate the signal from WJLP(DT), PMCM agrees, at its own cost, to ensure deliver[] of a good quality signal of WJLP(DT) through alternative means.”

Please clarify what you meant to say with this sentence. I assume that you didn’t mean to say that you aren’t duplicating yourself.

Fourth, it remains unclear what channel position you are entitled to be carried on (assuming you perfect your must-carry rights). SECTV-NJ has contracts with cable programmers that restrict moving them absent clearly superior must-carry rights.



Pursuant to Section 614 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and Section 76.64 of the rules of the Federal Communications Commission (“FCC”), this will inform you that PMCM TV, LLC, the licensee of Television Station KVNV, Middletown Twp., New Jersey (the “Station”) hereby elects mandatory carriage of the Station’s television signal pursuant to Section 76.56(b) on all cable systems operated by **Service Electric Cable TV of NJ AKA Service Electric Broadband Cable** or its subsidiaries and affiliates serving the New York, New York Designated Market Area (“DMA”) for the election period starting January 1, 2015 and ending December 31, 2017. 
Please note, the Station will be changing call letters before year end as it commences operations in New Jersey. The new calls will be WJLP DTV 3.
