Dear Ms. Dortch:

Sorenson Communications, Inc. (“Sorenson”), through its attorneys, is writing to respond to the ex parte letter dated November 3, 2015, in which Purple Communications, Inc. (“Purple”), among other things, asked the Commission to adopt the addressbook portability standard endorsed by five named VRS providers. As Sorenson has confirmed in meetings with VTC Secure and subsequently in writing,¹ Sorenson supports adoption of the X-Card portability standard proposed by Purple but was concerned about the possibility of duplicative or additional standards because VTC Secure was proposing to incorporate a different standard into the ACE platform. Now that VTC Secure has confirmed that it will use the X-Card standard in the ACE platform, Sorenson confirms its support for the adoption of the X-Card standard—provided that the Commission does not adopt any different or additional standard governing addressbook portability.
