On February 8, 2016, Rick Chessen of the National Cable & Telecommunications Association (NCTA), Paul Glist of Davis Wright Tremain LLP as counsel for NCTA, Jordan Goldstein of Comcast and Stacy Fuller of AT&T met with Matthew Berry and Bernie Archbold of Commissioner Ajit Pai's office.

They discussed how the video "apps" published by multichannel video programming distributors enable consumers to enjoy their multichannel service on hundreds of millions of tablets, smart phones, streaming boxes, smart TVs and other connected devices while respecting all programming licenses and agreements associated with the service. They also discussed their concerns based on the Chairman's fact sheet and the proposals of the Consumer Video Choice Coalition that the types of government intervention regarding navigation devices being contemplated could increase consumer costs, threaten security, ignore content licensing agreements, and undermine consumer protections, consistent with our comments in the docket.
