Stacy Fuller of AT&T and Neil Fried of the Motion Picture Association of America met with Marc Paul of Commissioner Jessica Rosenworcel's office on Feb. 10, 2016.

In a separate meeting that day, Neil Fried met with Phil Verveer of Chairman Tom Wheeler's Office.

In the meetings, they discussed how the video "apps" published by multichannel video programming distributors enable consumers to enjoy their multichannel service on hundreds of millions of tablets, smart phones, streaming boxes, smart TVs and other connected devices while respecting all programming licenses and agreements associated with the service. Consistent with their comments in the docket, they also discussed their concerns based on the Chairman's fact sheet and the proposals of the Video Choice Coalition that the types of government intervention regarding navigation devices being contemplated could increase consumer costs, threaten security, violate content creators' exclusive rights to determine whether and how to disseminate their content, run afoul of licensing agreements, discourage investment in programming and programming services, and undermine consumer protections.
