(“TWC”), and Advance/Newhouse Partnership (“Advance/Newhouse”) (collectively, the “Applicants”) met with Federal Communications Commission (“Commission”) staff copied at the bottom of this letter. Participating for Charter were: Catherine Bohigian, Executive Vice President, Government Affairs; Alex Hoehn-Saric, Senior Vice President, Government Affairs; Christianna Barnhart, Vice President, Regulatory Affairs; and Sam Feder and the undersigned of Jenner & Block. During the meeting, representatives for the applicants discussed the substantial public interest benefits the transaction will deliver to consumers.
