Dear Ms. Dortch,

I have reviewed the comment submitted by Mr. John Flynn on February 17th regarding a meeting with FCC staff on the same day.

Mr. Flynn comments on discussions of New Charter's "verifiable and enforceable commitments, including providing settlement-free interconnection under its interconnection policy ... which will provide the Commission with further assurance that the transaction will serve the public interest and deliver benefits to consumers."

I urge the Commission to proceed with as much caution as one normally would when buying a used car – **get it in writing**. To date, New Charter has not submitted a peering policy in writing that will support their stated intentions to behave for the benefit of their BIAS consumers. Further, there has been no sign of behavioral changes from any of these companies. TWC is still acting as a Gatekeeper when it comes to their own BIAS consumers and I have seen no evidence of any intention to actually OPEN these interconnection points for the benefit of BIAS consumers.

I recommend the commission deny the application unless New Charter submits an appropriate peering policy in writing and without expiration dates.
