I would hope the FCC would study the content found at the above referenced public internet website, in particular as attributed to Lee Badman, Devin Akin, Kerri Dale Capital Management, Dane Ericksen and Greg Gerst, and other comments, with the 13-213 proceeding's record, to discover the public interests that stand out.
