David and Chris,

This just came in. It is Media General's response which, among other things, takes the direct position – much more strongly than Media General did in the argument on Friday – that the JSA *by law* is grandfathered so long as Media General is a party to it. It also argues that the FCC has no authority to declare that compliance with the JSA would be against the law, and further that the order keeping WAGT out of the auction would not violate the auction rules.

I think that this removes any doubt about the breadth of Media General's arguments, and I would think its attempt to use this case as leverage to argue that the FCC cannot require its other JSAs to be terminated if the Commission approves the Nexstar transaction.

I would appreciate your passing it on to the team looking at this case and, of course, if we can answer any questions, you have but to ask.
