Dear Ms. Dortch:

On March 7, 2016, Catherine Bohigian, Executive Vice President, Government Affairs; and Alex Hoehn-Saric, Senior Vice President, Government Affairs, both of Charter Communications, Inc. ("Charter"), met with Matthew Berry, Chief of Staff for Commissioner Ajit Pai.

During the meeting, Charter explained the public interest benefits of its proposed transaction with Time Warner Cable and Bright House Networks. In particular, Charter will implement its over-the-top ("OTT") friendly practices, including a base broadband speed of 60 Mbps without data caps, throughout the New Charter footprint. In addition, Charter has committed to build out a million line extensions, invest over \$2.5 billion in commercial build-out, and deploy over 300,000 out-of-home Wi-Fi access points within 4 years of close. The Charter representatives pointed out that the transaction adds relatively few subscribers to those currently served by Time Warner Cable and therefore will not substantively change the status quo. In sum, the transaction will benefit the public interest and create no risk of harm.
