On March 10, 2016, Christopher Szymanski, Director of Product Marketing and Government Affairs at Broadcom Corporation, met with Chairman Wheeler's Legal Advisor Edward "Smitty" Smith, Commissioner Rosenworcel's Legal Advisor Johanna Thomas, Commissioner O'Reilly's Legal Advisor Erin McGrath, and Commissioner Pai's Legal Advisor Brendan Carr. In addition, On March 11, 2016, Mr. Szymanski met with Julius Knapp, Chief of the Office of Engineering Technology to discuss the above-referenced proceeding.

During these meetings, Mr. Szymanski expressed Broadcom's support for allocating the upper 30 MHz of U-NII-4 (5895-5925 MHz) exclusively for Dedicated Short Range Communications ("DSRC") supporting Intelligent Transportation Systems ("ITS") safety of life applications, and permitting unlicensed devices, such as Wi-Fi, to share the remainder of the spectrum with non-safety of life DSRC applications using advanced coexistence techniques.
