On March 16, 2016, Tom Rutledge, Chief Executive Officer; and Catherine Bohigian, Executive Vice President, Government Affairs, both of Charter Communications, Inc. (“Charter”), met with Tom Wheeler, Chairman; and Jonathan Sallet, General Counsel, of the Federal Communications Commission.

During the meeting, Charter explained the public interest benefits of its proposed transaction with Time Warner Cable and Bright House Networks and the ways in which it will enhance competition. In particular, Charter discussed significant expansion of its residential network to increase broadband and video competition, \$2.5 billion investment in building out its network to increase competition in the enterprise market, and the deployment of over 300,000 out-of-home Wi-Fi access points to increase wireless competition.
