Being a Hispanic business owner in Miami, Florida, I see how Hispanic low-income communities are finding it very difficult to access broadband Internet. Our students need to be able to access the tools they need online to help further their education. Our families need internet access for their current jobs and future employment. We depend on access to broadband internet for our daily lives, but unfortunately it comes at a higher cost than it should because two companies have a monopoly on the industry.

Many individuals in our Hispanic community attempt to gain access to these services, but they simply cannot afford them. This causes them to miss out on opportunities. As a Hispanic community leader I feel this is extremely unfair, and these providers need to have more competition.
