Dear Chairman Wheeler,

My name is Eladio Linarte, I am the President/CEO of Delite Entertainment. I am also a Hispanic Community Leader and business owner, Former Board member of the Tampa Latin Chamber and Hispanic Chamber of Tampa Bay. I am very concerned how broadband services are being monopolized by 2 providers and how consumers must be a part of it. Due to the lack of competition there is an overwhelming cost burden in the Hispanic community denying Low income families access to these services. These providers are continually using their influence to make sure that any remaining rules and regulations can only benefit them causing a huge disadvantage any competitors.

Being a Hispanic Business owner in Tampa Bay, I see how this has caused a rift in the Hispanic low-income Communities who find it very difficult to access broadband Internet. Hispanic students need these services at home and for school, but now this is only a disadvantage to low income Hispanic and other low income family. The wellbeing of these consumers are not even considered.

They attempt to access employment opportunities, but most employers only accept applications online and if families do not have access to these services then these individuals who can't afford these services for these opportunities. As a Hispanic Community Leader I feel this is extremely unfair and these providers need to have more competition, which will allow Hispanic low income families to have the access to broadband services they need.

Broadband prices are always increasing and service has decreased. The Corporations of these leading providers are not taking accountability and refusing to listen to the issues this is causing low income families and schools should have fair pricing for these services. I am requesting that competition be allowed in this market so that low income Families have a better choices for services and Low income families should have equal High Quality services as the average consumers.

Hispanic low income families must have has access to high quality and affordable broadband. I am asking in support that you, Mr. Wheeler as the Chairman pursue this matter with the Federal Communications Commission to take immediate action with this issue. These two Broadband Providers are Monopolizing over 80% of broadband lines and it must be changed.
