On April 5, 2016, Alex Hoehn-Saric, Senior Vice President, Government Affairs, of Charter Communications, Inc. (“Charter”), met with David Grossman, Chief of Staff and Media Policy Advisor to Commissioner Mignon Clyburn.

During the meeting, Mr. Hoehn-Saric explained that Charter’s proposed transaction with Time Warner Cable and Bright House Networks will deliver numerous public interest benefits. In particular, Mr. Hoehn-Saric discussed how the transaction and New Charter’s corresponding commitments will deliver increased buildout, faster broadband service, more jobs, and an industry-leading low income broadband offer. Mr. Hoehn-Saric also explained that opponents seeking denial of the transaction or additional conditions are incorrect, as Charter and the other applicants have previously detailed in the record.
