Vonage filed an ex parte letter on August 3, 2015, asking the Commission to expand its existing waiver (granted as part of the Commission's numbering trial) to allow Vonage to request numbering resources directly while OMB approval of the newly-adopted authorization process was pending. Vonage is now withdrawing that request, given that the Report and Order granting numbering rights to interconnected VoIP providers has come into effect¹ and Vonage has received access to numbers after filing the appropriate application and providing states with the requisite 30-day public notice.²

Vonage commends the Commission and the Bureau for their work in this matter and is pleased to be able to exercise its rights under the Report and Order in furtherance of the public interest.
