Dear Ms. Dortch:

On April 21, T-Mobile USA, Inc. (“T-Mobile”)¹ representatives Dave Miller, Neville Ray, Kathleen Ham, Cathy Massey, and myself met with Jon Wilkins, Bureau Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau. In a separate meeting later that day, the same group, with the exception of Cathy Massey, met with Julius Knapp, Ira Keltz, Walter Johnston, and Martin Doczkat from the Office of Engineering and Technology. During our meetings, we discussed the attached PowerPoint presentation.

We discussed T-Mobile’s continued investment in our network and leadership in deploying cutting edge technology and customer solutions. As a leader in technology development and innovative services such as Binge On, we stressed the need for flexibility in order to allow continued innovation. We urged the Commission to recognize the importance of protecting mobile broadband providers’ ability to differentiate in the highly competitive mobile broadband marketplace. We emphasized the need for the FCC to move quickly to clear spectrum following the Broadcast Incentive Auction and described T-Mobile’s proposal for an efficient and balanced repacking plan. We discussed the importance of LTE-U, T-Mobile’s plans for testing the
