On April 26, 2016, Catherine Bohigian, Executive Vice President for Government Affairs for Charter Communications, Inc. ("Charter"), and Alex Hoehn-Saric, Charter's Senior Vice President for Government Affairs, met with David Grossman, Chief of Staff and Media Policy Advisor to Commissioner Mignon Clyburn.

During the meeting, Charter explained that the proposed transaction with Time Warner Cable and Bright House Networks will deliver numerous public interest benefits. In particular, Charter discussed how the transaction and New Charter's commitments will deliver increased buildout, faster broadband service, and an industry-leading low-income broadband offer.
