
Dear Ms. Dortch:

The undersigned, on behalf of Advance/Newhouse Partnership (“A/N”) and Bright House Networks (“BHN”), recently spoke with Joel Rabinovitz and Kiley Naas of the FCC regarding certain information previously submitted by A/N in the above-referenced proceeding. Based on these discussions, A/N and BHN agree that they are no longer claiming confidentiality with respect to the following:

1. Within the material accompanying A/N’s October 21, 2015 Response to Information and Data Requests 60 and 61, the fact that BHN does not have available certain data on non-recurring revenue broken down by different service plan options.
2. Within the material regarding cybersecurity, as exemplified by Exhibit 45 in A/N’s October 13, 2015 Response to Information and Data Requests, the fact that: (a) BHN provides cybersecurity updates to management, including briefings regarding cybersecurity incidents; (b) BHN has formed a Security Governance Council, which includes C-suite/senior level participation, to gain executive visibility and spread awareness on information security risks, which receives updates about cybersecurity related breaches, trends, and training; and (c) BHN has a dedicated security team who reports to the CIO.
