To Whom it May Concern

Relay House is a small satellite uplink company. We own two trucks. The first uplink we did, had President Clinton as the guest speaker. We have gone from analog transmission, to standard definition and now various flavors of High Definition. Over the last 20 years, we have had to make costly purchases just to stay competitive.

I have had the opportunity to meet a great number of the engineers that run trucks like mine. From my experience I would describe them as truly professional. They care, they learn from others and are proud of the work they do.

The CID proposal that is under consideration has the strong possibility to put a good number of these quality engineers out of work in my opinion. I have four fairly new state of the art Adtec Encoders. These encoders are not compatible with the CID requirement if implemented. To replace these encoders would cost Relay House approximately \$160,000.

When we access the satellite, we give the access center our name and cell phone number. My carrier also displays our company name in the service ID. The satellite provider knows who we are and how to get in touch with us.

Please understand that this industry is run on very 'thin' margins. The cost of this proposal will devastate the majority, if not all, of the companies in our industry.

PLEASE RECONSIDER IMPLEMENTATION OF THIS PROPOSAL.
