On Monday, May 9, representatives of the National Diversity Coalition (NDC) had a conference call with David Grossman from the office of Commissioner Mignon Clyburn. The following members of the NDC participated in the meeting:

Robert Gnaizda, General Counsel, National Diversity Coalition

During the conference call we discussed the importance of the FCC decision, particularly as it related to independent diverse programming and our MOU as it related to diversity and the importance of the FCC emphasizing robust broadband speeds and full inclusiveness for broadband.


We discussed the importance of the FCC formal statements, which we were informed could be available in time to be considered by the CPUC on May 12 relating to its PD. We also discussed the importance of the CPUC's PD provision that allows CETF and the NDC to call to the attention of the CPUC future failures by Charter, and our belief that the provision alone could prevent such failures.

We also invited Commissioner Clyburn to be a keynote speaker at the NAAC's annual national conference on October 14 in Orange County, and the probability that she would be introduced at the conference by Senior Pastor Mark Whitlock. We also discussed that we hope to meet with all of the FCC commissioners individually when the NDC has its semiannual meeting in February in D.C.

We have endeavored to report our ex parte communication in a descriptive and informative manner in support of the policy and intention behind the FCC ex parte rule 1.1206(b)(1), as well as to encourage transparency and comprehensive ex parte reporting from all parties in proceedings before regulatory bodies.
