**Re: Notice of Ex Parte Communication: Amendment of Part 11 of the Commission's Rules Regarding the Emergency Alert System, PS Docket No. 15-94; Wireless Emergency Alerts, PS Docket No. 15-91**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On May 10, 2016, Thomas Maufer, Shahin Daneshkhah, Darah Franklin, and I, all representing Google Fiber (Fiber representatives), spoke by telephone with Gregory Cooke and James Wiley of the Public Safety & Homeland Security Bureau. The Fiber representatives expressed support for efforts to increase electronic access to State Emergency Alert Service (EAS) Plans.<sup>1</sup> In particular, the Fiber representatives noted that greater accessibility and uniformity of State EAS Plan information would ease participation by new entrants.<sup>2</sup> The Fiber representatives also discussed how Google Fiber implements EAS on its systems to ensure that subscribers have timely access to all relevant alerts.
