Dear Secretary Dortch:

On May 12, 2016, the undersigned along with Charles Small, Associate Director of Federal Affairs of the Washington D.C. Office of Governor Andrew Cuomo of New York, met with Commissioner Ajit Pai's legal advisor, Nicholas Degani, to discuss the above-captioned proceeding.

During the meeting, the parties discussed the points raised in the recent ex parte submitted by Empire State Development and the New York State Public Service Commission asserting that declined Connect America Fund ("CAF") funding be dedicated to advance broadband deployment in New York and the other states in which the funding was originally allocated. Mr. Small stated that the national auction currently under consideration by the Commission for declined CAF funds could result in the reallocation of this funding to other states. Such a result would not ensure the deployment of broadband services in those New York communities the FCC previously had identified as unserved or underserved by broadband.

To ameliorate these concerns, the parties discussed the potential approaches raised in the New York ex parte for partnering with states that are prepared to disburse the declined CAF funds. The group considered how to fund these states and align the FCC's reverse auction with state-specific broadband programs, including

New York's upcoming auction under Governor Cuomo's New NY Broadband Program. The group further noted that the Commission has ample authority to disburse the declined CAF funds directly to states and that aligning the FCC's auction with state broadband efforts would spur additional states to fund their own broadband programs.

Lastly, the parties discussed the attached letter from Senator Charles Schumer (D-NY), which was recently submitted to Chairman Wheeler on these issues.
