On May 16, 2016, Eric Loeb and I of AT&T met with Denise Coca, Kathleen Collins, Jodi Cooper, Nese Guendelsberger and David Krech of the International Bureau to discuss the comments and reply comments filed by AT&T in response to the Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the above-referenced proceeding. AT&T emphasized that the removal of the nondiscrimination requirements that apply to facilities-based IMTS traffic arrangements on the U.S.-Cuba route, as requested by the State Department, would best serve the interests of consumers by encouraging reduced settlement rates on this route pursuant to the same policies that have applied to all other international routes since 2012.
