Re: *Applications of AT&T Mobility Spectrum LLC, Tampnet Inc., Tampnet Licensee LLC, Broadpoint License Co., LLC, and Broadpoint Wireless License Co., LLC for Consent To Assign Licenses and Approval of Long- Term De Facto Transfer Spectrum Leasing Arrangements (WT Docket No. 15-255)*

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Tampnet Inc., Tampnet Licensee LLC (collectively “Tampnet”), Broadpoint License Co., LLC, and Broadpoint Wireless License Co., LLC (collectively “Broadpoint”) (the “Joint Applicants”) hereby supplement their prior response(s) to the Commission’s Request for Information. This supplement presents additional information concerning Tampnet and Broadpoint’s plans for ensuring a smooth and seamless transition for customers, as described in greater detail below.

Tampnet’s post-closing business plan contemplates continued service to Broadpoint’s retail, wholesale and roaming customers. As part of the transaction, Tampnet is not assuming Broadpoint’s existing arrangements with such customers primarily because Broadpoint’s current customer arrangements are not reflected in currently effective written contracts, but are month-to-month arrangements reflected on the customers’ monthly invoice. In connection with its planned network upgrade to LTE and overall plans to improve the quality of the service offering to such customers, Tampnet intends to seek written contracts with Broadpoint’s customers.

To insure that Broadpoint’s customers do not face an abrupt change or discontinuation in service, Tampnet and Broadpoint have made arrangements, under a Transition Service Agreement (“TSA”), to continue to provide current services at current prices to each of Broadpoint’s customers until the earlier of six-months after closing or the execution of a written contract with such customers. The TSA specifically addresses this transition process and contemplates that the parties will continue to provide services to existing Broadpoint customers that are substantially similar to those currently provided by Broadpoint. The TSA specifically contemplates continuity of the service plans, service features, and bill format that customers currently receive. During the transition period, Tampnet will actively communicate with customers the details of the network upgrade plans and the terms and rates for the services that

will be available over the new 4G LTE network. A copy of the TSA, which the parties intend to execute at closing, is attached hereto.¹

While the pricing plans offered by Tampnet may vary from those currently in place today, Tampnet intends to provide improved service at rates that are, on average, the same or lower than the rates currently offered by Broadpoint. Because Tampnet will upgrade the existing 2G network to a and deploy a new 4G LTE network alongside the existing 2G network it will be able deliver high-capacity and high quality data, transport, voice and roaming services over a more robust network than that which exists today. At the same time, customers will be able to continue to receive existing service over the 2G network, if they so choose. These are significant upgrades and improvements to services that current Broadpoint customers receive today. At the same time, because Tampnet expects to be able to deliver services at rates that are, on average, equal to or less than existing rates, current Broadpoint customers will not see a degradation in service, but will instead realize significant value from the services Tampnet will be providing over a robust high-capacity 4G LTE network after the transaction closes.
