In accordance with the FCC's 2005 *Wireline Broadband Classification Order*,¹ Delhi Telephone Company is hereby providing the FCC with the attached notice of the Company's discontinuance of common carrier broadband Internet access transmission service under tariff, effective July 1, 2016. Delhi Telephone Company will continue to provide common carrier wireline broadband Internet access transmission service on a permissive detariffed basis. In addition, following the notice to the FCC is the notice that Delhi Telephone Company furnished its affiliated Internet service provider, which is presently the only customer of the Company's broadband Internet access transmission service.

A copy of this notice is also being sent to the New York Public Service Commission, the Governor of New York, and the Special Assistant for Telecommunications at the Department of Defense.

Delhi Telephone Company currently offers common carrier broadband Internet access transmission service under tariff through the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA) Tariff F.C.C. No. 5. Delhi Telephone Company hereby provides notice that the Company has requested from NECA that it remove the Company [or Cooperative] as a provider of Digital Subscriber Line Access Services under Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, effective July 1, 2015

Delhi Telephone Company will continue to provide common carrier wireline broadband Internet access transmission service on a permissive detariffed basis. Delhi Telephone Company will post the rates, terms and conditions of its broadband Internet access transmission services to its website of www.delhitel.com. The Company will also make physical copies of its offering reflecting the rates, terms and conditions available for public inspection at its business office, at the address provided below:

The discontinuance of Delhi Telephone Company's offering of broadband Internet access transmission service under tariff, and the continued provision of such service on a detariffed basis, will apply to the entirety of the Company's study area. This includes the following exchanges: Delhi, NY

Delhi Telephone Company currently has only one customer for its broadband Internet access transmission service. That customer is the Company's own non-regulated Internet service provider (ISP) affiliate. The Company's affiliated ISP purchases broadband Internet access transmission service for use as an input for the broadband Internet access services it offers to residential and business end-user customers. The discontinuance of the tariffed offering of broadband Internet access transmission service will have no effect on the end-user services provided by the Company's affiliated ISP.

On May 2, 2016, Delhi Telephone Company furnished its affiliated ISP with the attached memorandum, which notifies the ISP of the Company's plan to discontinue its provisioning of broadband Internet access transmission service under tariff and to continue providing such service on a detariffed basis.
