On June 3, 2016, Michael Saperstein, AJ Burton, Peter Mihan, and MJ Barrois of Frontier Communications ("Frontier") met with Scott Jordan, Chief Technology Officer; Mary Beth Murphy, Brendan Murray, Susan Singer, Lyle Elder, Nancy Murphy, Adam Kleven, Anne Russell, Arian Attar, Kelsie Rutherford, and Andrew Manley of the Media Bureau; Antonio Sweet of the Office of Strategic Policy; and Matthew Collins, Susan Aaron, John Williams, Varsha Mangal, and Caroline Jones of the Office of General Counsel.

Consistent with Frontier's comments in these proceedings,¹ Frontier discussed the attached slide deck, explaining the significant policy and legal shortcomings of the current proposal to unbundle and disaggregate multichannel video provider ("MVPD") video products. Frontier also provided a demonstration of its FrontierTV Everywhere application ("app") and explained that the apps approach avoids the pitfalls of the Commission's proposed approach while still ensuring the Commission's stated desire to give consumer's the option to end set-top box fees.
