In accordance with the provisions of the FCC approved Region 19 Plan the Region 19 Regional Plan Update Committee (RPUC) is requesting amendment to its frequency allocation tables to reflect the changes made as a result of its fourth window application process. The requested changes have been reviewed by adjacent Planning Regions 8 and 30. Concurrence with the proposed changes has been granted by Region 8 (power restrictions to channels 611, 653, 770, 792 and 806 for the Rhode Island State Police as requested by Region 8 are agreed to) and Region 30 (copies attached). 

**Re: Region 19 Fourth Window Review**

Dear Chairman Pohorilak,

After an extensive review of Region 19's Fourth Window allotment, it is the opinion of Region 8 that no agency allotments will cause interference with Region 8 with the exception on certain channels allotted to the Rhode Island State Police.

Channels 611, 653, 770, 792, and 806 are adjacent to the assignment for the Suffolk County Police Department on Long Island, New York. The Rhode Island transmitter closest to Long Island produces an overlap of their 25 dbu contour with Suffolk's jurisdictional boundary on the easternmost part of the County of Suffolk. An adjustment to the Rhode Island State Police transmitter power (ERP) and an antenna reconfiguration may eliminate the problem. An alternative would be to change that channel allotment.

In order to expedite the process for the other agencies mentioned in your correspondence of May 21, 1998, we give approval for all channel allotments in Region 19's Fourth Window with the exception of the five channels allotted to Rhode Island State Police.
