This is to notify you, pursuant to FCC Rule 1.1206, that Dan Davids, Executive Vice President of A&E Television Networks and General Manager of The History Channel, Anne Atkinson, Vice President and General Counsel of the A&E Television Networks, and Margaret Reilly, Vice President, Legal and Business Affairs and Assistant General Counsel of the A&E Television Networks met with Helgi Walker, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Michael Powell and Anna Weinroth, Senior Legal Intern on November 12, 1998. We also had meetings with Susan Fox, Senior Legal Advisor to Chairman William Kennard; Rick Chessen, Senior Legal Advisor to Commissioner Gloria Tristani; and Anita Wallgren, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Susan Ness.

At these meetings we described how any must carry rules for digital television would be fundamentally unfair to cable programming networks because it would reinforce their second class status under the law. Networks such as A&E Network and The History Channel would be placed at risk if the Commission adopted duplicative must carry rules. Additionally, digital must carry rules would make no sense as a matter of policy. Such carriage requirements would assist only the most wealthy television viewers, not those too poor to afford cable television. They would assist only the largest broadcasters, not the most marginal, as was intended by the analog must carry provisions of the 1992 Cable Act. Given the


many uncertainties surrounding digital television, there is no reason to believe that must carry is the key element in the success of the digital transition.


