

WGHT Radio is opposed to granting LPFM licenses to new persons/companies wishing to come on the air. If low power FM spectrum is available, any LPFM licenses must be granted to existing Daytime AM stations that must still sign off the air at sunset. The whole concept of "Daytimers" is obsolete, and by forcing such stations off the air during critical morning and afternoon drive hours is forcing daytimers to struggle to stay alive, since prime advertising time is sacrificed during the short winter days. Therefore, IF LPFM is to come about, LPFM licenses must go only to AM daytimers to augment their existing AM operations. The FCC must serve existing broadcasters, and adding more competition to the struggling AM band, as opposed to helping those of us on the AM makes no sense.
