

Dear Ms. Salas:

On Tuesday, February 2, 1999, on behalf of Time Warner Telecom, Larissa Herda, CEO of Time Warner Telecom, Don Shephard, Vice President, Federal Regulatory of Time Warner Telecom, and I met with Commissioner Michael K. Powell and Kyle D. Dixon, Legal Advisor to Commissioner Powell. During the meeting, Ms. Herda explained that Time Warner Telecom had originally decided to provide local service to Internet Service Providers ("ISPs") based on the understanding, shared throughout the industry, that reciprocal compensation would apply to ISP traffic. She further explained that if reciprocal compensation were not to apply to such traffic, ISPs would ultimately be left to rely on incumbent LECs as their only available service providers. In addition, Ms. Herda explained that SBC currently possesses more than sufficient pricing flexibility with which to respond to competitive entry.
