 - 2) The Telecommunications Act of 1996 was crafted to promote competition in the local exchange by companies like WinStar.
 - Currently deployed in 30 U.S. cities

 - Hub Networks attached to Lucent Class 5 Switches
 - Will deploy in six international cities by the year 2000
 - Buenos Aires, Paris, London, Sydney, Tokyo, and Amsterdam
 - Will serve 50 major international markets by 2004
 - Residential project – timing of announcement

 - 3) Recent WinStar commercial developments.
 - \$2 billion strategic relationship with Lucent
 - \$1 billion transaction with Williams Communications
 - New point-to-multipoint system deployed in Washington, D.C. in 1998
 - Nationwide roll-out in 1999
 - Roof rights to 4,200 buildings at end of 1998
 - Target of 8,000 by end of 1999
