

Request assistance regarding the interpretation of FCC 98-273 that amended Sec 207 of 96-83. Specifically, the tenants and landlord of our property have conflicting interpretations regarding installing the dish on the attached patio belonging to the renter. The landlord insists that the railing of the patio is part of the building structure and the dish cannot be attached to it. The landlord insists that the satellite dish is allowed on the patio but must be mounted on a tripod that stands freely and is not supported by any part of the building structure. The tenants insist that the patio is for the exclusive use by the tenant and therefore is covered by the amendment allowing the tenant to mount the dish there. The railing is part of the patio structure and therefore used by the tenant exclusively.

The landlord sent out letters today giving the tenants three days to remove the satellite equipment. Please reply immediately to prevent the interruption of our television reception and the need to make arrangements with a cable service to provide television reception.
