Users need to be able to continue their normal personal and family activities, and NO changes should be made with regards to this frequency.

Licensed users should also continue to be required to obtain permission of the repeater owner to use the repeater!

This will prevent the decline and disruption of important radio communications not unlike the decline of 27 Mhz. Citizens Band.
