This is to advise you that United Broadcasters Company on November 9, 1998 and Jerome Thomas Lamprecht on November 10, 1998, filed 402(a) Petitions for Review of: Implementation of Section 309(j) of the Communications Act -- Competitive Bidding for Commercial Broadcast and Instructional Television Fixed Service Licenses, et al., MM Docket No. 97-234, GC Docket No. 92-52 and GEN Docket No. 90-264, FCC 98-194 (released August 18, 1998).

Petitioners challenge this rulemaking decision in which the Commission adopted general competitive bidding procedures to select among mutually exclusive applications for commercial analog broadcast service and Instructional Television Fixed Service (ITFS) licenses.
