MOTION FOR LEAVE TO FILE REPLY

Orion Communications Limited ("Orion"), by counsel, seeks leave to file its Reply to the Opposition to Orion's Motion for Stay *Pendente Lite* filed by Biltmore Forest Broadcasting FM, Inc. ("BFB"). In support of its position, Orion submits the following:


Orion has moved the Commission for a stay of its First Report and Order, released August 13, 1998, 13 FCC Rcd 15920, and its Memorandum Opinion and Order, FCC 99-74,

released April 20, 1999, insofar as they order the commencement of auctions to dispose of the Biltmore Forest frequency (and others similarly situated) pending judicial review by the United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit in Orion Communications, Ltd., et al. v. FCC, No. 98-1424 (D.C. Cir., filed September 15, 1998). Wilsyr has opposed that Motion for Stay. Section 1.45(b) of the Commission's rules states that replies to oppositions to stay requests will not be considered by the Commission. However, there are suitable grounds in this instance for waiving that rule and accepting this Reply.


Here, BFB's analysis of the law misapplies the relevant standards pertinent to stay requests. As such, it is mandatory that Orion be permitted to file a Reply to correct BFB's version of the law. Also, since it is possible that this issue may be heard in Court, it would be helpful to have it fully briefed at this time.

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
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
