On July 7, 1999, representatives of the Telecommunications Industry Association (TIA) met with Robert Calaff of Commissioner Furchtgott-Roth's office regarding the above-captioned proceeding.

The discussion related to TIA's comments, reply comments, and other documents previously filed in this docket. The views expressed during the meeting focused on an approach to implementation and enforcement of Section 255 that affords manufacturers and service providers the flexibility to offer a wide variety of accessible solutions across families or lines of products; the mechanisms that will be established for addressing consumer concerns regarding the accessibility of telecommunications products and services; and the potential expansion of the reach of the proceeding to cover products and services not contemplated in the plain language of Section 255. TIA also reiterated its commitment to continue working with the FCC and consumers to achieve the goal of Section 255 – the availability of a broad array of products and services that are accessible to persons with disabilities
