I urge you to strongly support the E-rate telecommunications discounts for schools and libraries.

The E-rate has an enormous impact, allowing thousands of schools and libraries to bring Internet access and distance learning to their communities.

The Holdrege Public Library System will receive about \$4000 in telephone rate discounts this year. We hope to be able to significantly increase the library's access to Internet resources in the next year or two. A library connection at T1 or greater transmission speed will make it possible for us to allow patrons we serve in Phelps, Harlan and Kearney Counties to use our library catalog via the world wide web. In practical terms, this would allow us to make some services available seven days per week and nearly twenty-four hours per day. Costs for such a high speed Internet connection would be just within reach with the help of the e-rate discounts. It is so important that we achieve this level of service that we must find a way. Without the e-rate discount, that way will likely involve painful tradeoffs.

This year, the full \$2.25 billion in E-rate discounts is needed or many communities will be left without access to the networked resources that are becoming the most dynamic engine of change in our economy and our culture.
