I am writing to express my growing concern about the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking that the FCC has begun on the issue of low-power FM, also known as microradio.

Unless second and third channel interference protections are reduced, there will be no low-power FM stations added in most major markets, however Low power FM's would have an adverse effect on small market radio. The only way those stations can go on line is for the FCC to reduce the protections against interference that make the FM band listenable. I am sure you will agree that no one benefits from interference.

I know you have many issues at hand, but this issue in particular is of great concern to our company and many small market radio companies like us.
