Introduction

Attached to this memo is the analysis you requested on November 30, disaggregating Exhibit 1 (Evaluation of NYSPSC - Reply, November 8, 1999) results into Flow-through and manual components.

File Description

The file is titled RepCom3.xls

There are eight sheets in this file:

UNE-P - This is the summary sheet, which was filed in our Reply Comments.

UNE-P - This is UNE-P Flow Through Results

UNE-P NFT <10 - This is UNE-P manual results for orders less than 10 lines.

UNE-P NFT >=10 - This is UNE-P manual results for orders greater than or equal to 10 lines.

The last four sheets follow the same naming convention, but are for UNE-L results.

The allocation of results into these three categories is consistent with the definitions contained in our Carrier-to-Carrier Guidelines.

If UNE-P and UNE-L results are combined by these three categories, the results agree with Bell Atlantic's Carrier-to-Carrier results (shown in BA's 271 filing, Attachment D, - Joint Declaration of George S. Dowell and Julie A. Canny).

September results if combined will not agree with DOJ's September Carrier-to-Carrier results (Exhibit 6, Page 8), since as previously discussed, I did not adjust these results for a

definitional change related to sop-qed metrics.

The source of this data are the Department's workpapers for our data replication efforts.

Please note, I allowed Excel to automatically scale the graphs, so variations from one sheet to another are not directly comparable to one-another.
