Dear Chairman Kennard:

On behalf of the City of Gaithersburg - a suburb of Washington, DC and one of the largest cities in the State of Maryland - I am writing to seek your support of our use of a temporary low-powered FM radio transmitter for our month long program, Winter Lights.

Winter Lights, a spectacular drive-through holiday light show for all ages, is now in its fourth season. Covering more than three and one half miles through beautiful Seneca Creek State Park, this event has brought holiday joy to the hundreds of thousands of people from around the country who have attended. In addition, those less fortunate have benefited, as annually the City of Gaithersburg donates a portion of the proceeds generated from Winter Lights to local charities.

Each year we have sought to improve the Winter Lights program by adding new light displays and improving traffic flow. This year, to complete the Winter Lights experience, our goal is to include a radio transmission of holiday music to those cars that drive through the show.

Winter Lights is held completely within a large state park, and our proposed transmission would occur only during hours of operation (6:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m.) from December 1, 1999 through January 2, 2000. As a result, we believe that use of a low power FM transmitter would not interfere with radio waves used by the broadcasting community and the general public.

While we are aware of other communities that use low frequency FM transmissions for large public events, we have received conflicting information from the FCC. Based upon our initial inquiry with the FCC earlier this summer, we were advised that the use of low power FM transmitters was permitted - as a result the City made significant commitments with one of our major sponsors to develop a musical recording as well as select transmission equipment. Only after we followed up with FCC staff this fall to obtain further information, were we informed that the FCC may not approve of such FM transmissions.


