We hereby provide notice, pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, of an ex parte presentation in the above referenced matter. On February 7, 2000, the Texas Office of Public Utility Counsel (Texas OPC), represented by Rick Guzman, Assistant Public Counsel; Scott Lundquist of ETI, Inc.; the National Association of State Utility Consumer Advocates (NASUCA), represented by Charles Acquard, Executive Director of NASUCA; and Gene Kimmelman of Consumers Union, met with Commissioner Gloria Tristani, and Adam Krinsky, Legal Advisor to the Commissioner.

We discussed the topics and issues that were contained in the Comments and Reply Comments filed by Texas OPC/Consumer's Union/CFA in this proceeding. In addition, the parties discussed the status of the CMRS industry as contained in the first 25 pages of the FCC's Annual Report on CMRS released Jun 24, 1999, FCC 99-136, as well as other CPP consumer protection issues referenced in the attached presentation. Moreover, the parties discussed the need for informative billing of CPP calls, and the impact of FCC action in this area on preemption of state consumer protection laws, as well as the need for a prohibition of revenue sharing arrangements between the CMRS carrier and others in order to prevent abusive CPP practices.
